## I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

2024 Skate Kansas City will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook and/or current Compete USA handbook, as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated, or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA ${ }^{\oplus}$ member, a collegiate club, or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For nonU.S. citizens, please refer to the rulebook for more information.

## EXCEL SERIES

Skate Kansas City is a part of the 2024 Excel Series and will offer all Excel levels, Beginner - Senior.

- Excel Free Skate Events to be judged IJS: All Excel "PLUS" levels (Preliminary Plus, Pre-Juvenile Plus, Juvenile Plus, Intermediate Plus), and Pre-Juvenile through Senior levels.
- Excel Free Skate Events to be judged 6.0: Beginner, High Beginner, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary.

Skaters must register through EMS to participate in the Excel Series prior to competition at designated competitions in order to have their points recorded and seen in standings. Excel skater registration closes on 3/1/2024

## MID-WEST FIGURE SKATING COUNCIL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Kansas City Figure Skating Club is a member of the Mid-West Figure Skating Council (MWFSC) and is participating in the Mid-West Council Championship Series (MWCCS). Participating competitions are Heartland Winter Classic, Snowball Spectacular, Skate KC, Heart of America, Wichita Mid-Continent Classic, Pony Express Championships, and Line Creek Fall Fling. Actual competitions will be dependent upon each hosting Club's final decision to hold their event. Points will be awarded for Beginner through Adult level events (Free Skate, Showcase, Jumps, Spins, Dance, and Compulsory) along with Compete USA events (Basic Elements, Basic Program, and Basic Skills Showcase).

Skaters may enter one of two tracks. The Comprehensive Track will include all events a skater enters (Free Skate, Dance, Showcase Events, Jumps, Spins, and Compulsory). The Free Skate Track will only include singles Free Skate events (Long Program for Intermediate - Senior). Skaters must indicate the track in which they wish to compete when they sign up. Track selection cannot be changed after registration.

Skaters competing in this Series will receive points for placement in each of the above events at the recognized competitions. At the end of the season, top point skaters will receive awards from MWFSC, and the club with the most skater-accumulated points will receive the Traveling Championship Trophy for that year.

There is an annual $\$ 10$ registration fee to enter the Championship Series, which can be paid at the first competition entered or by registering on the Council website at www.MWFSC.net.

## II. ELIGIBILITY

## Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
- Skate Up: Skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
- If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
- If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events, the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their Excel series entry.
- If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

## All other singles and partner events (such as Adults, Pairs, Ice Dance):

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the events level, but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group. Boys and girls may be combined to make an event, except for standard track short programs and free skates.

## SKATESAFE COMPLIANCE COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn to Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found HERE. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

Coaches of foreign athletes: If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

With EMS, coaches must be included within a skater/team's registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal via "My Coaches" or "Team Personnel." All coaches declared at the time of registration will be included on the registration confirmation email. Note: There is no registration approval process within EMS as the data (membership and test level) is tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database. Non-compliant coaches will receive automated email reminders through the start of the competition.

## MANDATORY ATHLETES

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

## III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration will open on Thursday, April 4 at 4:00 pm (if events begin on Thursday, registration will open earlier). Please check the KCFSC Website (https://www.kcfsc.com) for details. The registration desk will be open one hour prior to, and during, competition. Please register/check-in promptly upon arrival. Skaters must register at least one hour prior to their first event.

Please be sure to select the correct event and confirm your entry with your coach prior to submitting your entry. Entry fees do not include practice ice. Practice ice is purchased separately.

Online registrations will be accepted via EMS. Payment must be made at the time of registration by credit card only. Each transaction includes a 3\% transaction fee.

## PARTNERED EVENTS:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

## FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition (click here for HOW TO). This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the Members Only login page.

## TEST CREDIT

Skaters requesting test credit must select the option "Test Credit" during registration or through "Add Event" process within EMS. Late requests can be accommodated until March 3, 2024 by making a request via email KCFSC1@gmail.com where the payment must be completed online via EMS prior to receiving a credential and competing. Skaters can pick up their completed test credit packet from the Registration/Check-in desk approximately one hour after the event concludes. Test Credit packets are $\$ 15$ and only available for Juvenile through Senior well-balanced and Excel free skates.

## MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to the EMS Competition Portal no later than March 3, 2024 at 11:59 PM ET/10:59 PM ET. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a $\mathbf{\$ 3 5}$ late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

## IV. COMPETITION DETAILS <br> FACILITIES

The competition will be held at the Kansas City Ice Center, 19900 Johnson Drive, Shawnee, KS 66218. The ice surface is $85^{\prime} \times 200^{\prime}$, with rounded corners. A snack bar is available in the rink, as well as various restaurants are nearby.

## READY ROOMS

All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up, etc.). Rooms will be provided to leave your belongings and to put skates on but are not to be used for changing. Doors will remain open at all times. Changing will not be permitted in public restrooms.

Ready rooms are for athletes only. An exception can be made for athletes 11 years old and younger that will allow for one parent of the same sex to assist their child immediately prior to and after their skating event(s). Please review the Locker Room and Changing Area Policy and the SafeSport Handbook (both found on the U.S. Figure Skating SafeSport page).

## U.S. FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during InProgram travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe Handbook.

## OFFICIAL WEBSITE \& UPDATES

Official notices will be emailed to competitors through EMS and posted to the KCFSC website, https://www.kcfsc.com/. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent, and coach to read the messages for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are expected to arrive 45-minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

## SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries in the EMS Competition Portal. All participants will be notified via email once available.

## PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice is NOT included with your registration. Practice ice sessions will be 30 minutes. A maximum of 2 practice ice sessions may be requested per skater. Compete USA (Basic Skills) practice ice is 20 minutes and no music will be played.

transferred or sold to other skaters once purchased. Every effort will be made to play each competitor's music for short program and free skates, but this cannot be guaranteed. Compete with Us competitors will not have their music played on the practice sessions.

## PHOTO/VIDEO

Video will be provided to all competitors and is included in the entry fees. Instructions for receiving your video will be sent the week prior to the competition starting. Note, per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing and/or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited. No flash photography of the skaters on the ice is permitted. No tripods may be used and no rink power sources may be accessed.

## AWARDS

Medals will be awarded for the top four placements in all events, including Championship Events. All awards will be distributed, and pictures will be taken immediately following the posting of results. Medals may be engraved at an additional cost after the awards have been presented.

The Skate Kansas City High Points trophy will be awarded to the club, accumulating the most points based on the following: four points for 1st place, decreasing to one point for 4th place. All participating clubs are included. Pair/Dance teams must declare what club points are to be awarded to if both skaters are not from the same club.
